History – The House that Wilma Built

Often at our WVO meetings, we ask if you're a member of the Military Women's Memorial (MWM) (formerly WIMSA). We ask because we feel it's important. It's so important that we voted to designate a portion of our license plate money to our Memorial. Did you notice the words "our Memorial?" Yes, that's why it's important. It's important because it's *our Memorial* – it's a living history of the women who served or currently serve our nation, and it needs to include you.

Even though the Memorial turns 27 this year, many women have never heard of it. I always tell people if you're going through the main gate of Arlington, look to the right and you'll see a large, white hemicycle. That is our Memorial, which you can enter through Arlington. Even if you've been to it before, you should always visit it when you're in D.C. because the displays change and are inspiring.

OKWVO members marched across the bridge to be a part of history 27 years ago as it was dedicated, and we've been a part of her history ever since. Some senators said women already had the Vietnam Women's Memorial, but BGen Wilma Vaught argued that a statue or monument was not enough; what was needed was a memorial with exhibits about the contributions of women in the armed forces. Because of her fortitude and determination, we have a Memorial...we have the house that Wilma built!

If you were fortunate enough to attend any of the 30+ Women Veterans Recognition Days (WVRD) held in Oklahoma, you had the opportunity to meet and hear BGen Vaught speak. She came to many of them because she knew how important the Oklahoma women veterans are to MWM.

If you're not a member, please register your service with MWM so others will know about you now and in the future. Historians use our first-person accounts to prove and learn things about the past that were left out of history books. Your story will help others know we were there when history happened.
